Greetings Legion Family Members,




# **Harvey**Dog of War - Dog of Peace - Veteran

In July of 1862, President Abraham Lincoln issued a call for an additional 300,000 volunteers. Ohio answered the President's call and surpassed the quota for volunteers.

In August of 1862, the newly formed 104th Ohio Volunteer Infantry (OVI) was beginning to muster at Camp Massillon, Ohio in Stark County. The "camp" was so new that no tentage or supplies had been issued, and arriving recruits were put up in local hotels and private residences. The camp was nothing more than an open field among the rolling hills just west of the Tuscarawas River (now the site of Oak Knoll Park in Massillon).

The members of the regiment spent their first weeks organizing, building the camp and learning the skills of a soldier. Drill, drill and more drill. On August 29, the Regiment was finally mustered into Federal Service numbering 1,017 men, mostly from Columbiana, Stark, Portage and Summit Counties.



One soldier was 25-year-old Daniel M. Stearns, who had previously attended the Baldwin Institute, but was working as a machinist for the P & C Railroad in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Daniel was a member of the prominent Berea Stearns family (the 6th of 7 children), whose father had formed the Daniel M. Stearns Company, named after Daniels oldest brother. This quarry operation was established in 1857 in Berea, while the actual offices were located in Cleveland, Ohio. (The office building still stands at the corner of French and Merwin Ave. in the Irishtown Bend area of the flats.)

After the shelling on Ft. Sumpter, Daniel immediately enlisted on April, 24, 1861, in the Pennsylvania Volunteer Reserve Corps (PRVC), where he was made 1st Sgt, 8th PVRC 37th Regt. Co. B. He was later promoted to 2nd Lt. in October of 1861, and served in the Washington DC area and Virginia. On May, 19, 1862, he resigned his commission in the 37th Regt. PVRC and returned to his family in Berea, Ohio.

After a short time, Daniel entered the service for the second time. On August, 9, 1862, Daniel enlisted for three years as 1st Sgt. of D Company 104th OVI. It was there at Camp Massillon that another volunteer entered the regiment, "Harvey," an American Pit Bull. Harvey was one of several dogs that followed the regiment into battle, but none were as beloved as Harvey. He was reportedly wounded at least three times in battles in Virginia, Resaca, GA and Franklin, TN. It was also rumored he had been captured by confederate forces and was traded in a prisoner exchange. He moved freely about the camp, bringing comfort to the men. Harvey became the mascot of the regiment, so much so, that the 104th OVI came to be known as the "Barking Dog Regiment."



#### Membership Report for Fall, 2025

It's renewal time for Squadron 91's 2026 membership year. Annual dues stay steady for another year at \$30. We just ended our 2025 year on June 30, and it's time to start the 2026 year. We fell a little short of our state quota of 380 new and renewed members by only 17, ending the year with 363 folks on the books. Even with the slide in membership, we continue to be the largest and best Squadron in the 13th District and the third largest in the State of Ohio.

This year's State quota is 377 for new and renewed memberships, and we are off to a fast start. As of this writing, we have already recorded 64 on file, which includes three new members. Your membership is the life-blood of our organization, and your \$30 membership dues contribute to the overall programs of the Sons of American Legion at all levels: National, State, District and Post. Your dues go a long way to keep our organization growing. Remember, each of you are important to us and your promptness in forwarding your dues is greatly appreciated. Your Squadron funds help support multiple organizations in Berea and the surrounding area. Daniel had a special collar made for Harvey. It read, "I am Lieutenant D.M. Stearns Dog, whose dog are you?" Along with the nameplate are several other nameplates citing the battles Harvey served and participated in. (Harvey's original collar is on display at the Battle of Franklin Museum in Franklin, TN.)

Both Daniel Stearns and Harvey survived the war, and they participated in the reunions of the 104th for many years. A special portrait of Harvey was painted in 1885 and taken to reunions of the regiment where it was proudly displayed. Harvey was said to be the "longest serving member of the Regiment."

Daniel returned to Berea, Ohio, and was employed as a salesman in the family business. At age 33, he married Julia Ann Ackley in 1869 and eventually had three children. Daniel was said to have had a hard time adjusting to civilian life. Affidavits in his pension file in the national archives, mentions he preferred the company of his loyal dog, Harvey. Daniel was probably suffering from what we today call PTSD or "Seeing the Elephant," as it was called in his day.

It is not known when Harvey passed away, but we know Daniel was eventually admitted to the Northern Ohio Insane Asylum in 1888 by his wife and living brothers. His wife, Julia, removed him from the asylum shortly before his death at age 54 on December, 29, 1890. He died of war injuries and Brights disease in a boarding house of Mr. & Mrs. Richardson in Brooklyn Village. (Daniel is buried in Woodvale Cemetery in Middleburgh Hts., Ohio, (on the hill, Sect.

12, Lot. 1, Grave 1), just a short distance from the grave of Albert Baesel.)

On May 10, 2025, The Cuyahoga County Soldiers and Sailors Monument dedicated a statue of Harvey. It's located just off the corner of the monument, which is a dog park and pet relief station. This occurred in conjunction with their 3rd annual mental health fair. The statue was cast and dedicated with the assistance of the Parker Hannifin Veterans Resource Center and the Cuyahoga County Veterans Service Commission.

Daniel M. Stearns is listed on Panel #15 inside the Cuyahoga County Soldiers and Sailors Monument. He is also listed in the Allegheny County Soldiers Memorial Hall in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

On April 25th, 2025, Monument executive Director, Greg Palumbo, and County Monument Commissioner, Jon Silvis, dognapped Harvey prior to him being installed on Public Square, and took him to see the grave of Capt. Stearns and a trip to Oak knoll Park (formerly camp Massillon).
